









Focus: The Need to Know

Vaccination Rights Act Proposed: During a [press conference](#) on Tuesday, November 9th, 2021 at County Square in Greenville, SC local and state legislators presented a bill regarded as the “Vaccination Rights Act”. This bill proposed that employees, excluding Military, Federal Employees, Federal Contractors, Public and Private School Students, would reserve the Right to refuse producing their vaccination status should it be requested from them. This bill also proposes to combat the use of “vaccination passports”. While the attempt at protecting South Carolinians from such unconstitutional mandates is greatly appreciated, it should be noted that, without a Special Session, this bill has no opportunity to go to the floor before regular session begins in January while many are facing looming termination dates in the months of December, January and beyond. In addition, it should be noted that this bill does not ban vaccination mandates, but rather allows the individual being required to produce a vaccination status the right to refuse sharing such information. There was much controversy associated with the drafting and methods of presenting this bill and as to whether or not this bill is standing strongly enough for South Carolinians. Crowds gathered at County Square were highly dissatisfied with the bill, the exclusion of certain employment/student status, and the timing of potential implementation stating, “This bill is too little, too late”, “This bill does nothing for me and my family NOW”, and “This bill has no teeth and seems to be political theatre.” Many hoped for a bill more like Bill 177 already proposed by Senator Tom Corbin or more in line with actions taken by Governor DeSantis of Florida or Governor Abbott of Texas.

Call to Action: We have to keep the pressure on Governor McMaster, Speaker of the House Jay Lucas, and Senate President Harvey Peeler. *These individuals have the ability to call our SC legislators back into Special Session* to vote on the proposed bill or other bills already introduced such as Bill 177. Please email these contacts and call up to 3x a day per the advice of Reps Bill Chumley and Mike Burns respectfully demanding a special session!



SCSBA Voted to Withdraw from the NSBA: The South Carolina School Board Association has felt the pressure and your voices are being heard! They voted to withdraw SCSBA's membership from the National School Board Association effective immediately and to request a refund of SCSBA's 2021-2022 membership dues. In a letter sent from the SCSBA President, Cheryl Burgess and Executive Director, Scott Price on November 8th, 2021 the decision was made clear to the NSBA and referenced the damage done in relation to NSBA's September 29th letter to Joe Biden. Going further, they noted the apology letter from the NSBA addressed to state associations on October 22nd has not been followed with significant action.


Committee Callouts

Parliamentarian's Perspective

Periodically, members of the GCGOP Rules Committee will share an aspect of Parliamentary process as a way to educate and encourage everyone in their participation in GCGOP meetings.


Voting

There are three ways in which voting normally occurs at GCGOP meetings. The first and most common is the voice vote. When a vote is called for, the presiding officer states the motion and asks for those in favor to say "Aye" and then asks for those opposed to say "No." This is the fastest and easiest way to get the sense of the body and to pass or reject a motion.

If the voice vote is close, then a standing vote is called. The presiding officer asks that all that are in favor should stand and the Teller Committee counts those standing. Then he or she asks that all that are opposed should stand and the Teller Committee counts those individuals.

The third type of voting is when voting for officers. If an officer race has multiple candidates, then a secret ballot is the appropriate voting method. This is the type of voting that we do at the bi-annual county convention for officers.

In most cases, a majority of the votes cast decides the issue. There are some special cases where a higher percentage than a simple majority are required. We will discuss those special cases in a future Parliamentarian Perspective.
